

SBOD festivities start Friday night, April 3rd, with a dinner at Coyote Point Yacht Club, continue on Saturday, April 4th, with breakfast, the Boat Parade, lunch, and award ceremonies at Sequoia and dinner at Peninsula Yacht Club that night, and wrap-up with a Gin Fizz Breakfast at South Bay Yacht Club and the opening race of the SBYRA Summer Series on Sunday, April 5th. The theme for SBOD 2009 will be "Legends of the Bay". Also, this is the year that the Tall Ships Lady Washington and Hawaiian Chieftain will be a part of the SBOD festivities. Beer Can season will start with our Beer Can Kick-off Meeting on Wednesday, April 8th, at 6 PM and follow with the first night of actual racing on Wednesday, April 15th (make sure you've filed your taxes before coming down to race!) at 6 PM.

In *April 1980*, PICYA granted us some money and our event became Opening Day in the South Bay. All the clubs south of Oyster Point and San Leandro were invited to participate. Sequoia Y.C. continues to host the event and the other clubs also had events during the weekend for us to attend.

A Look to the Past

This year our *Opening Day* in the South Bay is on *April 4*, 2009. Sequoia has held an Opening Day since the tradition was first established, but the only notations I found in our bulletins was an announcement for this event on *April 29*, 1945. Breakfast was at Scanus Restaurant on Middlefield Road and races were scheduled for the afternoon. We are missing bulletins from 1945 to 1964 and we have scant information in between.

The next mention was *Opening Day, April 12, 1964*. This was our ground Breaking Day for our new clubhouse. There was a decorated boat parade and races. Commodore Thompson asked for one large beat-up anchor and one or two tons of chain. However we didn't get the anchor that now graces our front entrance until 1996, when Al Caesar and seven other members bought our anchor from Allemann Brothers Boatyard in San Francisco. He also requested a pair of running lights. You can see them at our rear entrance.

On *April 4,1965*, the announcement stated that Fizzes would be served at 0800 and breakfast at 0900. The price was \$1.50 for adults and 75 cents for children. The parade would be at 12 noon. Race would start at 1300 large boats and small boats at 1310.

The next year, *April 17, 1966*, the agenda was similar. But, breakfast for adults was \$2.00 and children \$1.00. The Mariners, sailors from a Girl Scout ship, would watch the children who would eat at 0800. Two years later on *April 21,1968*, Fizzes at 0800. Fizzes have become a tradition for Opening Day at our club. Reservation were required and restricted to members and immediate family.

The San Mateo County Fair Association donated trophies for our *April 19, 1969* event. The trophies were for the best decorated boat. Bob St Clair, County Supervisor, and the Fiesta Queen were among the judges.

The agenda for Opening Day on *April 19, 1970*, was as in the previous events. What was added was that all the yacht clubs in San Mateo County were invited to compete for the trophies. Miss Yachting, Pam Kelly, and County Supervisors were among the judges. (Cont. p 4, col 1)

February and March proved to be very busy months for racing. We finished the 5-race Redwood Cup Series; the 5-race Winter Series; the Sail Fleet Captain's Regatta and the St. Patrick's Day Race. We also started our racing speaker series with the first topic on downwind sailing. The two hour discussion was lead by Bruce Ladd with over 30 people attending. Special thanks to Stan Phillips for arranging the speaker series and Larry Mayne for making the food arrangements.

For the Redwood Cup Series, first place honors goes to Charlie Watt, *Head Rush.* Second place goes to Ray Collier, *Linda Carol*; and third place goes to John Graves, *Metridium*.

For the Winter Series Spinnaker Division, first place honors goes to Charlie Watt, *Head Rush* and second place goes to Paul McCarthy, *Lucky Duck*. For the Winter Series Non-Spinnaker Division, first place honors goes to Rick Dalton, *Iowa* and second place goes to Dan Doud, *TimBuktu*.

We held our first annual Sail Fleet Captain's Regatta. This consisted of 3-races on one weekend with no throw-outs. The races coincided with Redwood Cup #4, #5 and Winter Series #4. First place honors goes to Charlie Watt, *Head Rush* and second place to Ron Brown, *Black Sheep*.

Our annual St. Patrick Day's Race coincided with the Winter Series #5 race. We had 14 boats on the starting line. On March 28th, we start the Summer Series. Single-handed #2 race is on April 11. The Beer-can Series starts with a kick -off dinner on April 8 with the first race on April 15. Also get ready for the new Westpoint Marina Regatta on April 18. This is a 25 nm race starting at TI, rounding Alcatraz and heading for Redwood Creek entry Buoy's #3 and #4. 
