




Floato de Mayo Saturday, May 1^s 16:00 - 22:00

Earth Day "Dockwalkers" Program Thursday, April 22 18:00 - 20:00 SYC Oates Room

The "Boating Clean and Green Campaign," sponsored by the California Coastal Commission (CCC) and the California Department of Boating and Waterways, is a state-wide-program to promote awareness of potential damage to our regional boating areas. One innovative part of this campaign is *Dockwalkers*, a volunteer effort to distribute information right to the quayside in every marina. Co-sponsors of this training include: the USCG Auxiliary, Keep the Delta Clean Program, Project Green-Works, West Marine and others.

SYC is hosting a special training session for *Dockwalker* volunteers on Earth Day, Thursday April 22, to carry out a local clean boating outreach. We invite SYC Sea Scouts, USCG Auxiliary members, and the local boating community including other yacht clubs to participate.

This two hour long free class provides an overview of environmentally safe boating practices, how to conduct *dockwalking* Saturdays, free boater kits for distribution to marina occupants, and a chance to win one of three boating jackets offered by West Marine. All SYC members who are interested in protecting the South Bay are invited to join in.

Friday, March 19, 2010 at Sequoia Yacht Club by Bill Lee

Part of the Opti Racing Team, specifically Kyle Larsen, Kieran Sweetman, and Logan Lee, from PYSF came to the Friday night Drop in Dinner to present the 2009 San Francisco Bay Opti Championship Perpetual Trophy to the Sequoia Yacht Club. The annual regatta, which is the oldest continuous Opti regatta in California, was hosted by PYSF and Sequoia Yacht Club last October and the overall winner was Kyle Larsen, who sails for PYSF and Sequoia. Kyle presented the trophy to Petra? and the entire Opti Racing Team has vowed to win the championship again this year so it can remain at Sequoia for another year. The Opti Racing Team has had a great year, and just completed the Richmond Small Boat Midwinters (a five regatta series) placing 1st and 2nd overall for Kyle and Logan. The most recent bay area regatta was the BAYS Winter Opti series #4 regatta at Encinal Yacht Club last month with Kieran, Kyle, and Logan placing 4th, 5th, and 6th overall. But the most recent outing for the Opti team was down at Marina del Rey earlier this month where the California Yacht Club hosted the Harken #1 regatta for Opti sailors all along the west coast. Kyle placed 4th overall out of 37 Optis in the championship fleet and several of our Opti Racing Team sailors were in the top third finishers. But the big excitement on the Opti Racing Team, was that 5 of the 6 team sailors on the PYSF/SYC Opti championship fleet team qualified for National Team Trials last year when the qualifiers were held. Doing well at National Team Trials means a sailor can get on the national Opti team and earn a chance to go to international regattas representing the USA. The Opti Racing Team is raising money to help offset the costs of attending Team Trials in Houston at the Texas Corinthian Yacht Club from April 29 through May 2. The team certainly appreciates the donations from the Sequoia folks at the dinner last Friday and it has put them well on the way towards getting the money to attend National Team Trials. Anyone interested in helping support the Opti racing team go to Houston for their National Team Trials may donate through SYC to PYSF (which is tax deductible).




