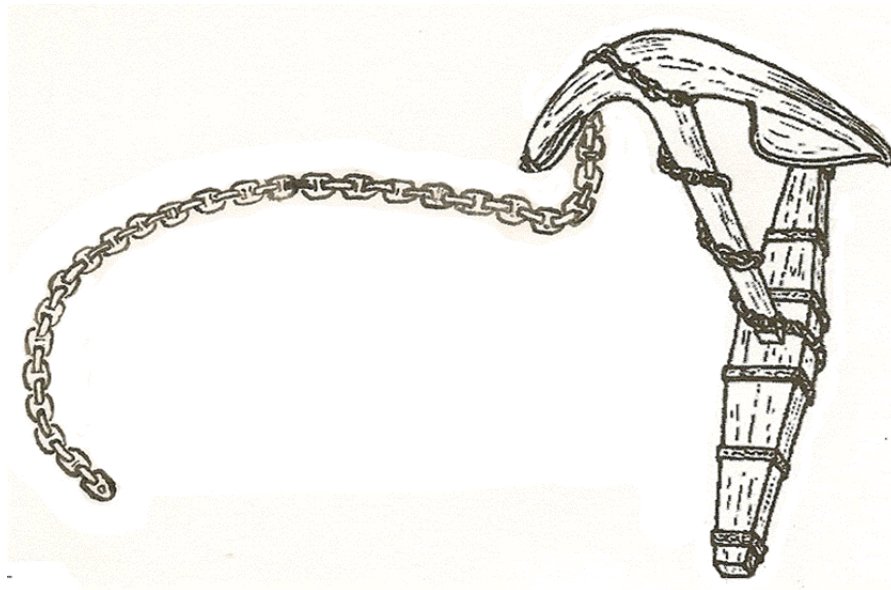

SYC's own 5th Annual Hannig Cup took a different "twist" this year when it was moved to June 23rd to coincide with the birthday of special guest Louis Van Amstel from Dancing with the Stars and So You Think You Can Dance. Each year the event has raised thousands of dollars for youth charity and youth boating program. It was started by Club members as the "Give Something Back" sailboat race to honor the boating tradition of helping others in our community. John Farnsworth dubbed it the "Hannig Cup" and Kate Humphreys donated a beautiful silver perpetual trophy. In the past four years the event raised a total of over \$75,000, in large part due to the organizing and running of the event by our very own Kris Butler.

This year's theme was "Sailing with the Stars" followed by "Louis Luau", a tropical birthday dinner. When friend Louis Van Amstel heard from Ted Hannig what a special and meaningful gift it had been to have a charity fundraiser on his birthday, Louis was inspired to help us on Louis birthday, June 23rd. Flying with Louis up for the event from Hollywood to support "Sailing with the Stars" were stars from movies and TV. Among the highlights was a birthday song from David Hernandez (American Idol, Season 7) and Ryan Boone (who appeared on Scrubs just the night before). The event sold out quickly in advance.

There are two trophies that night, a "first to cross" speed trophy, and the "Hannig Cup", awarded at the end of the evening for most dollars raised by an actual or virtual sail boat.

After a beautiful sail out to Y, and despite light winds, Odyssey crossed the finish first earning Alex Huang the "first to cross" Time Capsule Trophy. Ashore, guests and racers got to celebrate in the double "birthdays" of Louis Van Amstel and Ted Hannig. Both shared their birthday to kick off the fundraising for PYSF and other youth beneficiaries. Birthday gifts to PYSF included a special \$5,000 surprise donation in Ted's honor from Joe Bullock (an annual donor of wild game and this year roasted pigs for the luau).

By the end of the luau dinner, Larry Mayne and his crew had won the Hannig Cup, in recognition being the "boat" to have raised the most money for PYSF.

In addition approximately \$20,000 raised for PYSF that night, a number of other charitable organizations supporting youth programs received grants. While the original goal had been \$25,000, with all the extra effort and Hollywood help, the total award money distributed to youth related programs exceeded \$150,000!

Some of the charities and donations included \$30,000 for scholarship for young cancer victims, \$20,000 for Sequoia Hospital (where Ted was born), and \$10,000 each for both the Boys and the Girls Sea Scouts program. Kainos received \$10,000 for "Pete's Place". \$7,500 was donated in scholarships for the nearby Fair Oaks neighborhood. Somewhere2turn (a youth gang avoidance program through crew dancing) received \$6,500. Other recipients included the Marine Science Institute, Juvenile Diabetes, YFES, Ronald McDonald and the Boys and Girls Club.

A video of the event was taking by Movie and TV star Mary Margaret Humes and the video of our Club's event was featured at the Hollywood birthday party for Louis.

Racing Fleet

As August arrives we find ourselves in the midst of some of the best sailing of the year. Our Summer Series and Single-handed Series are well underway, and we look back on a number of individual races that also make up the SYC racing program.

Ron Brown was the race director for the WestPoint Marina Regatta held on June 12. The race started at Treasure Island, rounded Alcatraz Island to port, and ended at the entrance to Redwood Creek. There were 15 boats in the race, with 10 in the spinnaker division and 5 in the non-spinnaker division. The Sequoia Yacht Club was represented by 6 boats, and Pursuit (John Ryan) took third in the spinnaker division, and Iowa (Rick Dalton) took second in the non-spinnaker division.

The Moonlight Marathon was held on June 26. There were 10 boats in the race in two divisions: A (mono-hull, 9 boats) and B (multi-hull, 1 boat). Carmelita (Chris Lewis from St. Francis YC) took first place in division A, with Metridium (John Graves) and Sweet Pea (Tim Petersen) taking second and third place in division A. Roshambo (Darren Doud) took first in division B. The race started at 16:00 and the last boat crossed the finish line just after 23:30 under a beautiful full moon.

Our Beer Can Series continues on Wednesday nights with the Sequoia Racing Fleet turning out in force each week for this fun, on-going competition. The Los Gatos Invitational Challenge also is underway, initially as a subset of the Beer Can Series and finishing as a Thursday night race. Brett Herr is poised to clinch first place in the series and to retain the trophy for Sequoia.

June was an amazing month for the SYC program, with a schedule that offered over 112 nautical miles of club racing. Hearty congratulations should be given to Robin Weber who completed 104 nautical miles and Phil MacFarlane who completed all 112 nautical miles in club races during June. Both achieved this milestone in part as a skipper and in part as a crew member on other boats. So if you get the chance, ask them about racing in June. You should hear some great stories.

Come on out for the Beer Can races in August, and be sure to be a part of the final Summer Series race on August 21. There is no better sailing anywhere than on San Francisco Bay in the summer. I look forward to seeing you at the start line at one of the August races.

For Nauti Girls & Buoys

We set off from Encinal YC and everyone was in good form. Our crew consisted of myself, son Rob, Robin Weber, Don Inouye, Winston Bumpus, Phil McFarlane, Mike Lazzaro, and Ron Brown.

We got into irons outside the Golden Gate as the wind dropped to 5 knots (it was not meant to do that according to previous day's forecast!) - got ourselves sorted out, changed to 150 Genoa from 115, and finally got under way again (lost about 40 minutes). We pushed out with the Genoa to where we could fly the kite. Flew the kite the rest of the way - during the day it was exhilarating, but at night it was challenging. Finally, we were gaining on the boats ahead.

Phil McFarlane was at the helm when it happened. We were on two watches and about to change at midnight when the boat rounded up hard a couple of times and something failed on the upper rig. It was difficult to work out just what failed, but we have some theories. We dismasted at 6 minutes past midnight in rolling seas and pitch black. The top half of the mast broke taking all sat nav and radar with it and the boat was a mess.

Thank goodness no one was hurt. We have a big mast and boom and the likelihood of an injury was high - we got lucky. We also had a great crew with a lot of experience. There was tremendous teamwork, everyone stayed calm and everyone did all they could - obviously the more experienced guys took a big load at this stage. We called the Coast Guard and asked them to stand by in case we needed help. We had four of our best guys cutting away the rigging but it was tough going to cut away everything we needed to. We finally got all the rig cleared and could start the engine. It was a remarkable effort. It took about 45 minutes, but a very tense 45 minutes indeed. We lost the jib, main, all the rigging and three sails plus damage to the deck and rails. Fortunately we did not damage the hull.

We worked out where we were with the handheld GPS and Winston Bumpus' excellent charts and set a course for Monterey from about 20+ miles offshore. It was a really bad rolling ride for next 6 hours and most everyone was very sick. We made it to Monterey about 07:30, docked and had a Coast Guard inspection, breakfast, tidied up the boat and got a ride back so we were all at Westpoint by 13:30 Saturday.

It was not quite the adventure I was looking for, but certainly an experience not soon forgotten. The boat will get fixed and should be better than new. Lastly, my son Robert was with us and I am very proud of him - he handled himself with courage and did a lot of the heavy lifting when we got into serious trouble - he is a fine young man and a good sailor.

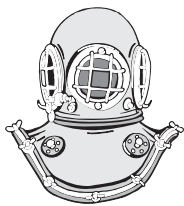
