

# A Look to the Past

We have just completed our 71st year as a Club and starting our 72nd year with new Flag Officers and Board of Directors. Let's thank our past Board for all that they did to provided us with successful and excellent year and wish the new Board another successful year.

71 years is a very long time and a while back we were wondering how many members have we had since 1939. We gleamed our list from old PICYA Yearbook and the used our membership roster. We save our rosters but they only go back to about 1967. (We now save a copy of all our rosters.)

Our best estimate is that more that 1,519 persons have joined Sequoia Yacht Club since the beginning of 1939. This estimate cannot be considered accurate even though it includes all categories of membership. It does not include spouses or members without boats. The early Yearbooks did not list non-boat owners. We started listing these members when rosters were printed, our numbering system did not start until the 1st of January 1967 and the numbers were issued alphabetically.

In 1967, there were 85 members on January 1st. #001 was issued to Frank Barbaria and #085 went to Dennis Woodman. Those that are still active are: Flemming Blucher -002: Al Caesar- 008; Glennis Durkin - 024; Marge Johnstone -038; G.E. McElroy - 050; Carl Ondry - 062; Donald Warren - 079; Bernice Wahle - 078 and Brian Welsh - 082. But our oldest member is Fred Smales, Commodore '44, Honorary #H15. He now lives in Hawaii, but occasionally visits us. (Honorary and youth membership has and uses a different numbering system.)

Our membership at the beginning of the year was about 255. Our most recent membership number issued was #955. I will look forward to meeting member #1000 in the not too distant future!

# Racing Fleet News

Our 2011 racing season is now underway and the first Redwood Cup and Winter Series races have been completed. We are off to a great start, with 13 boats participating in the first Redwood Cup race, and 15 boats in the first Winter Series Race. I would like to extend the invitation to all Sequoia Members to come out and participate in our racing program. It is a great opportunity to sharpen your sailing skills and to enjoy the post-race BBQ and recap of the race events. There is something to be gained for sailors at all levels.

Robin Weber, our Redwood Cup Fleet Captain reports that Redwood Cup #1 turned out to be a graduate-level course in sailing skills and foul-weather gear selection. The race began in light air and when the wind died 30 minutes later the entire fleet was bunched closely together at mark #8. Boats were pushed by a strong ebb, several out of the channel or into marks, and two boats had to start their engines to avoid running into other boats or going aground. The wind filled and the racers were treated to a visibility-reducing downpour as they headed north toward #12. The race from the Turning Basin around "12" and "Y" finished in moderate wind with first place going to *Head Rush*, Charlie Watt, second place - *Espresso*, Dave Ballentine, and third place - *Smokin' J*, Stan Phillips.

Our first Winter Series race took place on November 13. The wind crystal ball was quite murky before the race, so a twice-around course of 3/4 - Sp - 12p -Ys - 3/4 was selected for a total distance of 9.66 miles, with the option of racing only a single circuit if the winds failed to build in the afternoon. With initial winds of about 8-10 knots the starting horn went off promptly at 13:00 and the race was on. Although the winds continued to be difficult to gauge throughout the day, the Sequoia racing fleet completed both circuits on a beautiful November afternoon. First place went to *Head Rush*, Charlie Watt, second place to *Pizote*, John Ryan, and third place went to *Linda Caro*l, Ray Collier.

Mark your calendars now for Redwood Cup #2 on Sunday, Dec. 5, and for Winter #2 on Saturday, Dec. 11. If you haven't been in a race in a while, make it a point to get involved in one of the upcoming races. Looking forward to seeing you at the start line in December.




# Sequoia Reads: The Hard Way Around

Just in time for holiday giving and those long, rainy evenings of January, a fantastic new biography of Joshua Slocum has been released called <u>The Hard Way Around</u> by Geoffrey Wolff.

Slocum's <u>Sailing Alone Around the World</u>, tells the story of his three year, 46,000 mile solo circumnavigation in a hand-

built 37' sloop *Spray* at the turn of the 1900s.


