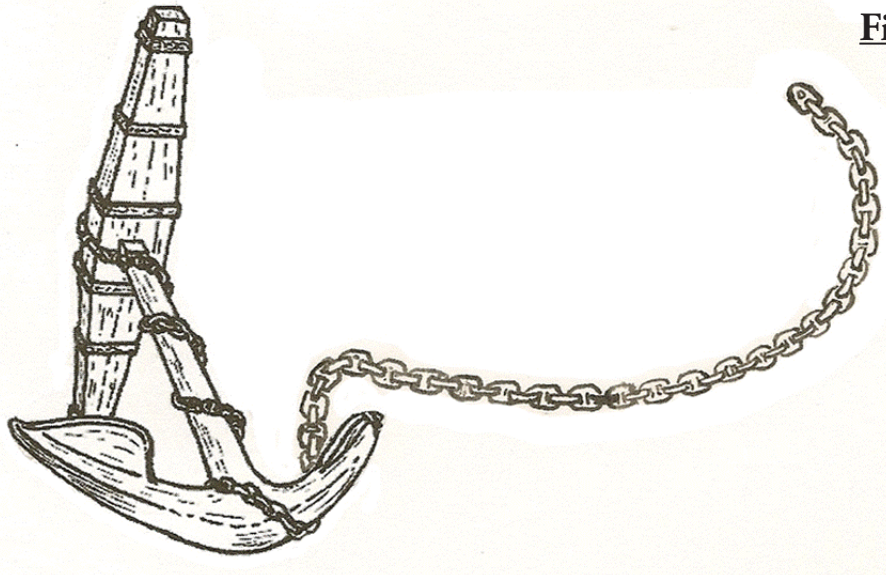

A Look to the Past

Sixty years ago, Dr. August Fromm gathered together some boaters in San Mateo County for the purpose of forming a yacht club. These meetings probably took place in 1938. Our research has not been able, as yet, to determine exactly when these meetings occurred. What we know is that our Club was established in the first months of 1939. They joined the Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association of Northern California (PICYA) and they were listed in PICYA's 1939 Yachting Yearbook. Which was published in the first months of the year. Our first event was "Opening Regatta" on April 16th. On July 23, Sequoia hosted the Peninsula's first inter-club regatta with Palo Alto Y. C. and South Bay Y. C.. So far, our scant information comes for the Yachting Yearbook and the Peninsula Yachtsman, vol 1, No.1 published in August 1939.

Dr Fromm is our Founder and First Commodore. The Yachting Yearbook lists Will Rebec, Vice Commodore; Joe W. Baker, Port Captain and Clyde Curry, Secretary/Treasurer. The Directors were Everett Hansen, G. R. Barth and Clyde Curry. The motor boat fleet members were John Erickson, Francis B. Tinney, John Broning and Miss Gladys Layton. (So we were not always an "all male club"). We also listed two Sea Scout Ships: *Vailina* (motor) Burlingame and *Buccaneer* (sail) San Mateo.

Our members listed in the Sail Yacht Registry were: Will Rebec, Ted Muscio, Robert Clifford, F. Bain, R. G. Grandy, Stanley Schoof, Geo. Guntli, Harold Somerville, Gustav Barth, J. Everett Hansen & August Fromm. Carl R. Koch was a Snipe sailor. J. B. Harris is listed with NCPCA (a power boat ass'n)

There may have been other members who sailed small boats, but if they did not belong to their class association, they may not have appeared in the Yearbook. What we know is that 20 or more boaters were charter members of "Sequoia" 70 years ago. "Happy Anniversary Sequoia" and congratulations to all our members. We do belong to a great Club!

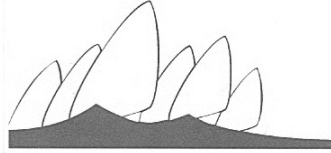

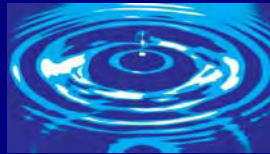

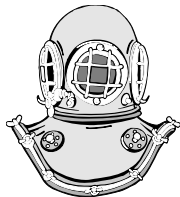
