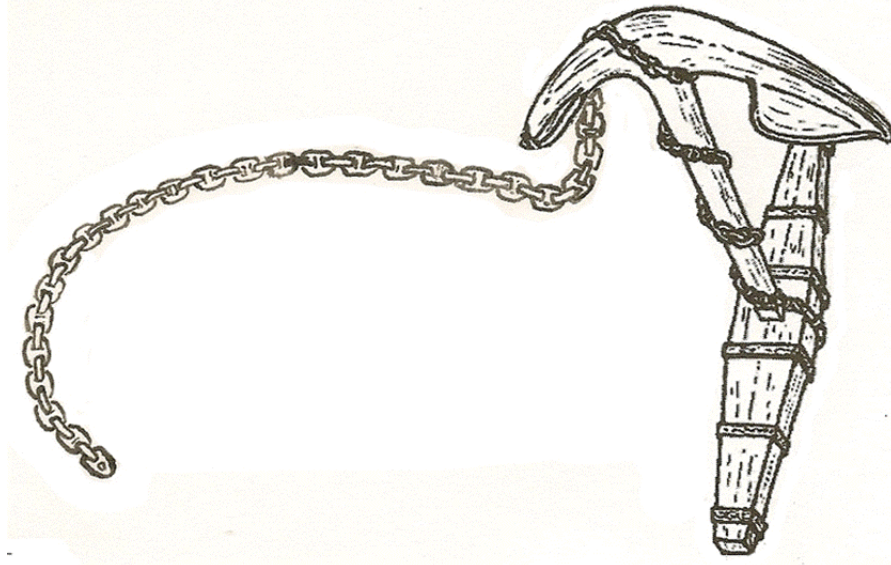

As I write this article we are half way through our winter races having just completed Redwood Cup #3 and looking back at Winter #2. So far the Sequoia racers have encountered just about every condition possible for this time of year, from gusty winds and heavy rain to no wind at all under sunny skies. Our winter series races also remind us just how big a factor the tide and current can be in a race, as demonstrated particularly well in Winter #2 when the lead boats were swept down the bay by a strong flood tide with the wind having died just as they reached the downwind mark.

Although *Head Rush*, skippered by Charlie Watt, continues to dominate both race series, there are many close competitions for the remaining spots. There are 4 ties in the scoring for various places in the Winter Series, and 3 ties in the scoring in the Redwood Cup Series. We've had a great turnout so far, averaging 14 boats per race, and we look forward to continued support as we move into the final races for each series.

February marks the return of Sequoia Single-handed Race Series. The first single-handed race is scheduled for **Saturday, February 5**. This is a four-race series with one throw-out race, open to both Sequoia members and racers from other parts of the bay that want to test their skills against our single-handed fleet. The race start line is between Redwood Creek Channel markers 3 and 4 with a Skippers Meeting at 10:30 and a 12:30 start.

Although we are still in the midst of winter, it's time to start thinking about Beer Can Racing. Steve Holmstrom, our Beer Can Fleet Captain for 2011, will be holding a Beer Can Fleet meeting on Wednesday, February 16 at 19:00. The meeting agenda includes a review and discussion of the race rules, handicapping, schedule, discussion on a proposal to add an occasional Friday night Beer Can and more. So plan on attending this meeting as we wait in anticipation for the Beer Can fun to begin.

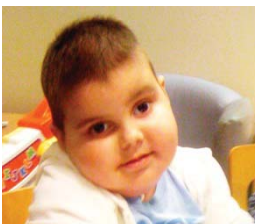
At this meeting we need to discuss:
