



Commodore's Report

We have some great news about our deck project, and as a part of that, we will have a Special Meeting on January 7^{th} to vote on the proposal to fund the project. Following is some background and details:

As you may remember, the membership approved plans for an expanded deck as a part of replacing our current, aged deck. As a required part of that process, we submitted plans to the Bay Conservation and Development District (BCDC) because the new deck would be larger than the current deck. On June 24, 2010, a BCDC representative visited SYC and determined that the deck plans encroach on protected marshland. Over the last five-plus months of negotiation, the final position of BCDC is that SYC is required to provide mitigation for encroaching on protected marsh land by either a) establishing a volunteer's work day twice a year for three years that cleans the shores of the entire harbor area that the club is in, or b) donating \$5,000 to a non-profit in the area that works to restore marshland areas.

The Board made the decision that committing the membership to work projects years into the future was not in the best interest of the club. We have had couple of members who wish to remain anonymous step forward to donate the funds to meet the BCDC requirement!

This clears the way for obtaining the financing for the project and the need for the Special Meeting to approve that financing. As you may remember, the original plan had the Club using the Port for financing as a part of negotiating our lease extension. However, another anonymous member has offered to loan the Club the necessary funds at a very competitive rate and without all of the delay and paperwork that would result in borrowing the money from the Port. As a result, the target completion of the new deck will be May 1st, assuming the membership approves.

During the Special Meeting portion of the General Meeting on January 7th, the Board will ask the membership to approve borrowing \$55,000 at 2.75% for 60 months, resulting in a monthly payment of \$982.18 and a total payment amount of \$58,930.77.

What is in a boat? You are, of course. In a big boat you stand up and walk around. In a small boat you stand up and fall in the water. Dang, I'm wet...

In a big boat you can sit on the leeward (low) side or the windward (high) side of the boat. In a small boat if you are on the leeward side you just capsized your boat. Dang, I'm wet again...

In a big boat you have a head. In a small boat? Well, I hope you planned your sail. Oops... wet again.

Small boats are fun, but they are different, and whether you are in a small boat, or a big boat there is one thing they both have in common. SAFETY SHOULD COME FIRST.

Here are some tips for small boat safety.

- -Sail with a friend.
- -Wear a PFD with a whistle attached. (Your voice might weaken after time in the water)
- -Beginners should sail in light winds only. (Under 12 knots)
- -Be sure to have a bail bucket, and tie it in with a line.
- -Have an oar or paddle on board.
- -Know how to swim! (If you can manage in a PFD, hmmm...? well OK)
- -Have a "chase boat" ready. If possible, a boat with motor on standby is a good backup.
- -File a sail plan. Even on the smallest outings, tell someone ashore where you're going.

And here are some considerations when getting into a small

Can you sit on your tail for the duration of your sail? Getting wet is part of the fun, are you ready for it? Are you trained for what to do if you flip? It's no biggie if you know how to deal.

And our favorite slogans for when you are under duress: When in doubt, let it out. Tiller to trouble, on the double.

For more advanced outings:

Bring food, water, and clothes for changing conditions. Don't know your "right of way?" Bigger is right. Always avoid a collision.




