



Racing Rules, MADE Easy



The Beer Can races have started and we have had some good winds. One of the challenges of the Beer Can race is that you are continually put into a position where you are passing a boat or you are being passed. In May's column, I discussed the right of way concerning a

starboard/port passing (starboard has rights). In this column, we will look at the situation when you are on the same tack.

When boats are on the same tack and are overlapped, Rule 11 of the RRS applies. Rule 11 states: When boats are on the same tack and overlapped, <u>a windward boat shall keep clear of the</u> <u>leeward boat</u>.

When boats are on much different angles of sail, it is often difficult to know which boat is the leeward boat. the boat that will hit the other's leeward side or be hit on her own windward side is the leeward boat. As a good rule of thumb, the boat that is on a point of sail closer to the wind is the leeward boat.

The usual question asked in a windward/leeward situation is 'how far does the windward boat have to stay away to keep clear?' The Windward boat (W) has to stay far enough away so that while the Leeward boat (L) is sailing a straight line, (W) will not hit (L) or force (L) to take any avoiding action. Furthermore, (W) must stay far enough away so that (L) can change course in both directions without immediately making contact. Also, if you are converging with (L) and both of you are sailing what you each believe to be your proper course, Rule 11 requires (W) to keep clear of (L).

When either racing in to or out of the channel at Redwood City, this rule will come into play a number of times. At all times, you should understand whether you are the (W) or the (L) boat. If you are the (W) boat, develop strategies where you can stay clear of the (L) boat. If you are the (L), just head to the finish line as fast as you can.

Until next month, just get out and start racing with us. The Beer Can series has started and it is a great way to have some fun and also learn the racing rules as you go.

A Look at the Past

I was perusing some of our copies of old newsletters and noted that in the past June was full of notable activities. In June 1945, Sequoia Yacht Club joined the Yacht Racing Association of San Francisco. Al Davies entered his Bird boat, *Loon* in Y. R. A. and gave

them a peek at our Sequoia burgee.

It was on June 1st, 1964 that the contractor turned our Clubhouse over to completed. The Golden Gate Y.C. loaned us their old wooden chairs till we got our own. Our members donated \$1,500 to furnish our Club. We acquired some dishes and turned to next project to get some silverware.

June 21,'64, Deane Davis scheduled a Lingerie Show modeling the latest fashions by Jer Marai, but it was rescheduled for September.

June was the month for the annual cruise-in parties. Groups of north bay clubs would sail to Sequoia and we would have a big party. The yacht clubs included Aeolian, South Bay, Golden Gate, Metropolitan, Coyote Point, Point San Pablo, Oyster Point, Presidio, and the Sausalito clubs. They would come in groups of four or five. It's a tradition that has faded.

June was, and still is, the month for preparing for our annual Delta Cruise. In the June 1970, newsletter it had to following recommendations: 1) Tune your engine—no one wants to be seen at the wrong end of a tow line. 2) Have a second anchor. 3) Get a second icebox—one for things you use a lot and one for those things that are used less often. 4) Have a boarding ladder that extends below your waterline. 5) It is hot in the Delta. a simple awning made of cloth supported by 3 - 2x2 will help. 6) Mosquitoes are worst at dusk. Tape cheese cloth to the hatches and vents. Repellant is a must. 7) Have charts of the Delta. There are a 1,000 miles of waterways.

These recommendations were repeated in 1971 with 3 additions: 8) Bring a Barbeque grill. 9) Have an anchor light that is self-sufficient. 10) Bring as much food as you can. Food is generally high and limited in the Delta.

Have things changed very much since those days? Have a great time in the Delta, it's one of our long standing traditional cruises.


