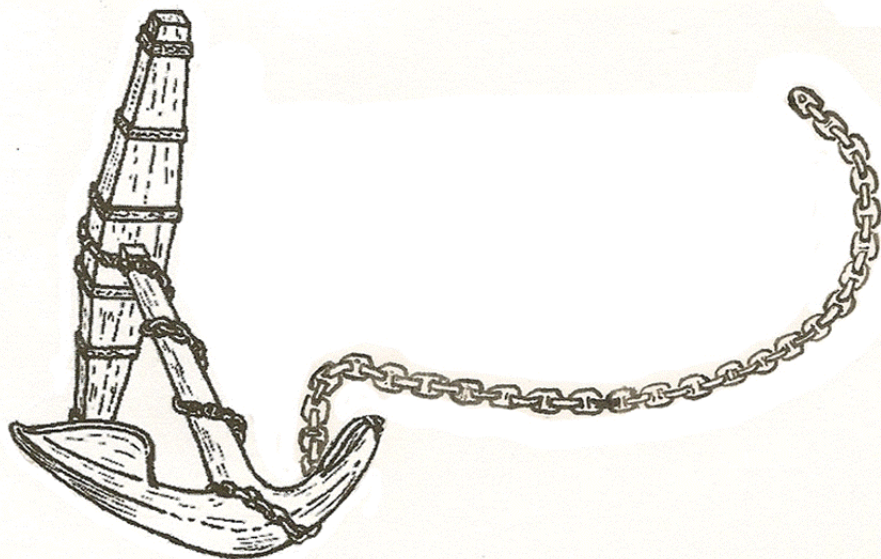

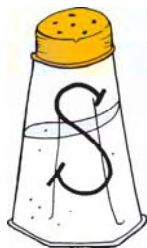

Looking at the SYC race schedule, there is little doubt that June is the crown jewel in the 2010 racing season. In addition to Summer #3 on June 5, and the ever-popular Beer Can Series on Wednesday nights (there are 5 Wednesdays in June), the **Westpoint Harbor Regatta** is being held on June 12, and one of my personal favorite races, the Moonlight Marathon, is being held on June 26. The challenge is out now for someone to race in each of these events and to boast to having sailed over 100 nautical miles in SYC club races in a single month.

Ron Brown is the Race Director for the Westpoint Harbor Regatta. The race starts off the NE end of Treasure Island, rounds Alcatraz Island leaving the island to port, and finishes at Redwood Creek Channel markers #3 and #4 for a total distance of 25 nm. A tri-tip dinner that night after the race and breakfast the following morning will be held at the club. Contact Ron or see the SYC web site for more details and to sign up.

The annual **Moonlight Marathon** will be held on Saturday June 26. The race starts at Redwood Creek Channel markers #3 and #4, continues under the Oakland Bay Bridge and around Blossom Rock, and then finishes once again at the entrance to Redwood Creek for a total distance of 39 nautical miles. This year the race coincides with the full moon, and a dramatic moonrise at 9:01p is expected. So be sure to check your navigation lights and tide tables, and provision your boat for a great sail under the moonlight. If you haven't sailed in this event before, this is the year to do it.

Check out the SYC web site for the latest Summer Series standings. Keep your calendars marked with Dos Equis every Wednesday for Beer Can Racing, and watch for some interesting Beer Can events after the races. Don't forget Summer #3 on June 5. If ever there was a month to get out and race, June 2010 is it. Hope to see you at the start line, and watch this column and the SYC web site to find out if anyone completed the 100 nautical mile challenge.

Contact Robin (*Agave*) Weber if you want to get a berth at South Beach Harbor on Friday night, July 30th.

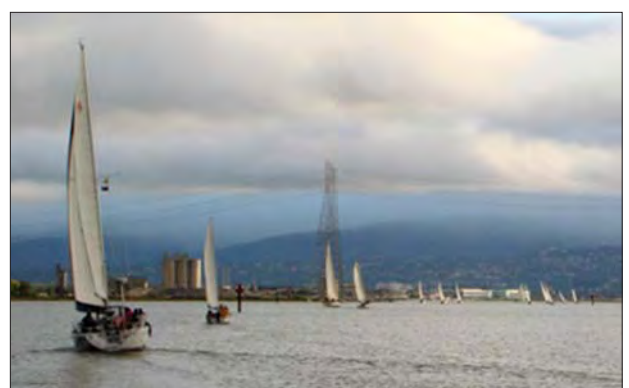

A Look at the Past by Peter Nardini, Club Historian & Past Commodore

I wondered if you know of the three advocacy (lobbying) organizations that represent you and the yacht clubs in California and in Washington D.C.? Each advocate interacts with our Legislature and Congress and their respective departments to insure the bad laws and regulations are not promulgated and beneficial laws and regulations are enacted.

In California, BOAT, Recreational Owners Associated Together, was organized in 1966 after an unsuccessful attempt by PICYA to prevent the closure of a delta slough with the construction of a bridge. PICYA together with Southern California, SCYA, hired a young attorney, Jerry Desmond, to represent and lobby for the boaters. In 1982 they changed their name to RBOC, Recreational Boaters of California, so as not to be in conflict with BOAT-US. There are 14 members on the board, 1/2 from PICYA and 1/2 from SCYA, who are appointed by each yacht association. It is supported by our annual contribution. Their web site is www.rbooc.org

The 2nd advocate is NBF, National Boating Federation. It is strictly a volunteer organization with an office in Annapolis, MD. It was formed in 1966 to represent boaters in Congress and with the federal agencies. PICYA is a regular member and our delegate is Margot Brown. Sequoia YC is a member club. They review all issues that effect boaters and yacht clubs. A current issue is the use of ethanol in gasoline. Their web site is www.n-b-f.org.

The 3rd advocate is BOAT-US, was launched in 1964 by Ellison and Schartz to provide service, savings and advocacy for the nation's boat owners. In 1982, they entered into a co-operative agreement with RBOC. That's the reason for their prominent presence in California. Their web site is www.boatus.com. I suggest that you visit these web sites and be informed of the issues that affect you as a boater and assist in their campaign to safe guard our sport and recreation.
