




A Look to the Past

Last month, I erred. It was **70 years** ago that our Club was founded. Sorry! I'll try to watch my arithmetic in the future. I was reading a recollection written by Commodore Cutler Brown, our commodore in 1945. He came to the bay area around 1943 to work, but could not find a house in San Francisco, so he settled in Redwood City. He liked sailing having done it in Southern California. He bought a sailboat and tied it up in the Redwood City marina. Such as it was. He describes it as a row of pilings parallel to the bank between which a walkway was secured. Another row of piles was driven out from the walkway to fasten the stern lines as the boat headed in and tied the bow to the walkway. There was a swimming float at the end of the walkway complete with a diving board.

When he got his boat and was ready to go out on his first sail, the Harbormaster told him that he could not leave the dock until he acquired a CPSF number. This was a mandatory number issued by the Captain of the Port of San Francisco. This was during WW II and there were restrictions on all marine activity in the bay. The number had to be 6 inches high painted on each sides of the bow. If you had a powerboat, the number had to be painted on the cabin roof. To get a CPSF number, one had to go to the Custom House in San Francisco, to be photographed and to give a life history! If all were found to be in proper order, one would be issued a card attesting to the fact that the boat was registered. Now, we register with the state and receive CF numbers.

He mentions how they used to sail out to the old wreck that is across the bay from our harbor entrance. It is an old "four stacker" destroyer that the navy flyers from Moffet Field used for bombing practice during the war. A couple of our junior members were once picked up by the Coast Guard for sailing too close to the wreck. Till next month.

For Nauti Girls & Buoys



This month the Nauti Girls snagged an interview with stalwart sailor, Kathryn Maxwell, about her attendance at the Southern California Women's Sailing Conference. So tell us, what was it all about, Kathryn?

On Feb. 7th, my friend Lauri and I attended the 20th annual Women's Sailing Convention sponsored by the Southern California Yachting Association and held at Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club in lovely Newport Beach. I estimate about 200 women attended.

It was wonderful to have an entire day devoted to learning things about sailing that have eluded me up until now and to improving my knowledge of sailing. Learning from other women offered a different perspective from my "husband training", as good as that might be. The convention offered many practical seminars on topics such as navigation, First Aid, diesel repair, head repair, preparation for cruising, sail trim, and many other topics. It was hard to choose which ones to attend.



One of my seminars was *Basic Navigation*. In a short 1-1/2 hour seminar, I learned how to find my position on a chart, how to plot a course, what the latitude & longitude markings mean on a chart, & how to estimate distance to an end point. In this age of GPS, I was happy to know how to use my charts.

In our *Intermediate Sail Trim* session, I learned that sail trim boils down to 4 things – belly, belly, angle & twist. I thought I would spend the next few years really getting what sail trim was all about. In this simple presentation by Captain Jeannea, I felt that I finally understood the basics that had previously felt so mysterious. Our team had such a good time practicing that we missed the entrance to Newport Harbor by over a mile and had to turn around to go back!

I would love to go next year with a whole group of woment from Sequoia YC. We would have a great time, learn a lot and represent our club. See you there?


