


A Look to the Past

For Nauti Girls & Buoys

One sunny afternoon, several summers ago, I had the privilege of spending three blissful hours learning to sail an El Toro. My instructor was Roberta Barnes, the doyenne of the SYC Junior Sailing program. I couldn't spin around and duck under the boom quite as deftly as Roberta; she and the kids out for lessons made me feel clumsy and oversized in the little bathtub shaped hull. But we had a wonderful adventure as we ventured out into the harbor turning basin in our tiny craft. It was as if time stood still and the sun, water sounds and wildlife were all that mattered.

For those of you who may not know, the El Toro is a one design racing boat that originated in the late 1930s at the Richmond YC. In honor of the many 'Bull Sessions' about the design, the members decided the 8' pram should be named El Toro (Spanish for 'bull') and bear the emblem of a shovel on its sail. Many El Toro's are lovingly kept in vintage condition in garages and basements up and down the Pacific Coast. SYC owns a small fleet used to train the junior sailors. The international one design fleet is more than 11,000 and most are sailed right here on the SF Bay.

The most famous El Toro regatta is called the Bullship Race. Every year scores of intrepid sailors decide to sail their 8 foot El Toros roughly 4 miles through shark-infested waters to demonstrate their bravery and yachting skills. The 57th annual Bullship Race, rescheduled for April 24, will start in Sausalito (near Horizons Restaurant), cross the treacherous "slot" and end up on the San Francisco city front at the St. Francis Yacht Club. The winners are known as Vencedores in keeping with the Spanish theme.

There is an International El Toro Racing organization, www.eltoroyra.com, which organizes and records the results of many more El Toro regattas held each year in the Bay area. Active fleets race in Tiburon, Richmond, Oakland, Fremont and at other local yacht clubs. Some local El Toro Regattas include: *Flight of the Bulls* (Foster City, May 8), *Fremont Relays* (May & June on Lake Elizabeth), *El Toro Stampede* (Richmond YC, October 3) and our own *Corkscrew Slough Regatta* here in Redwood City on October 9!

So think about that challenge to sail an El Toro or Laser on June 19th. Get wet, get sunburned and rediscover why you wanted to sail in the first place.


