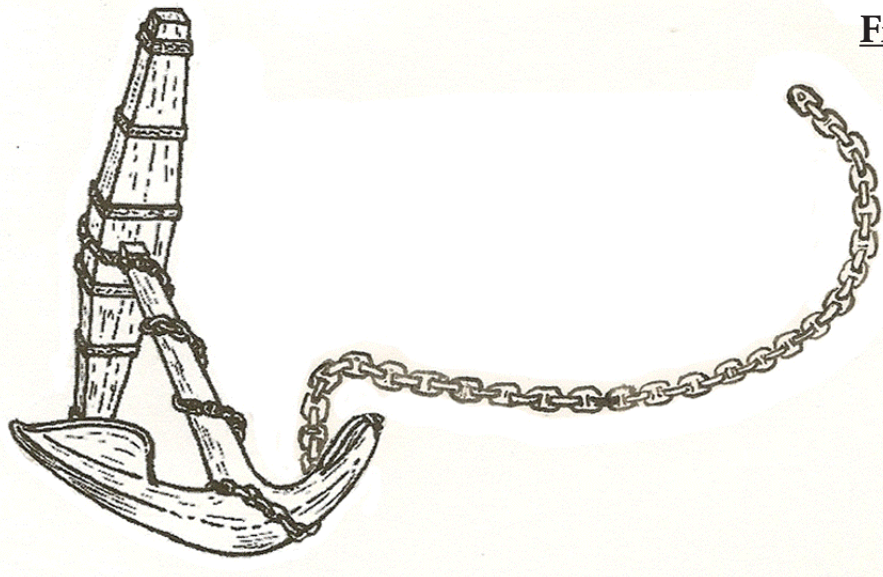

Racing Rules, *MADE Easy*

In my last article, I discussed RRS (Racing Rules of Sailing) 18.5- Passing a Continuing Obstruction. This rule is pertinent to boats racing back into the channel and what can be done when the course is at the edge of our narrow channel. The corresponding rule for beating out the channel is RRS 19- Room to Tack at an Obstruction.

First, running aground is defined as an obstruction, so the edge of the channel would be considered an 'obstruction'. RRS 19.1 states- *When approaching an obstruction, a boat sailing closed haul or above may hail for room to tack and avoid another boat on the same tack. However, she shall not hail unless safety requires her to make a substantial course change to avoid the obstruction. Before tacking she shall give the hailed boat time to respond. The hailed boat shall respond by either*

- (a) *tacking as soon as possible, in which case the hailing boat shall also tack as soon as possible, or*
- (b) *immediately replying 'YOU TACK' in which case the hailing boat shall tack as soon as possible and the hailed boat shall give room, and rules 10 (starboard/port tacks) and 13 (same tack, overlapped) do not apply.*

This rule is used when calling for 'sea room' when you reach the edge of the channel. It is considered a 'safety rule'. The purpose of this rule is to permit a close-hauled boat caught between another boat on the same tack and the edge of the channel to avoid running aground without loss of distance when a substantial change of course is required to clear it. RRS 19 only applies to boats on the same tack.

When all conditions of RRS 19.1 are met, a leeward boat or one clear ahead (Boat A) will be able to call for "ROOM TO TACK" to a nearby boat (Boat B) that is otherwise preventing her from tacking. At this point in time, Boat B must make a decision. Boat B must tack as soon as reasonably possible OR it must hail back to Boat A, "YOU TACK". Boat A then tacks and Boat B remains on it's original tack, keeping clear of it.

Some final comments when Boat A calls "ROOM TO TACK"

1. Boat A is now committed to tacking; it cannot change its mind. It must tack as soon as Boat B tacks or Boat B hails "YOU TACK".
2. At this point of time, Boat B cannot challenge BOAT A's decision to hail for room. It must keep clear of Boat A. Boat B can file a protest, but will have to prove there was no safety issue or requirement for substantial course change. This will be difficult to prove in our channel.

Have a safe sail out the channel and stay off the mud!

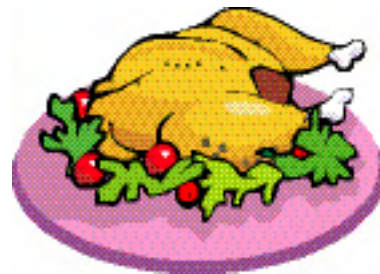
Thanksgiving Cruise Out to Angel Island November 27-30

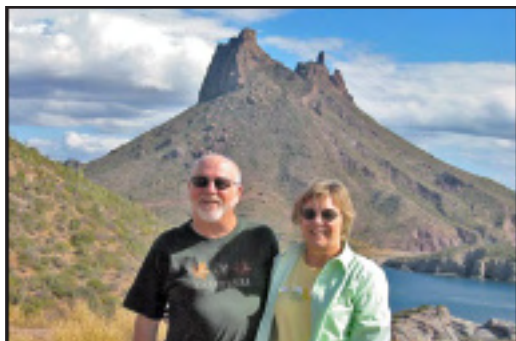


Cruisin' Notes

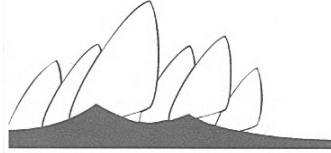

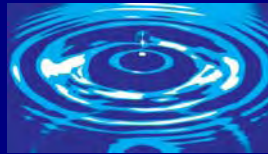

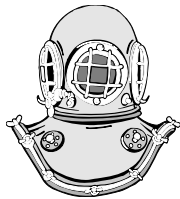
