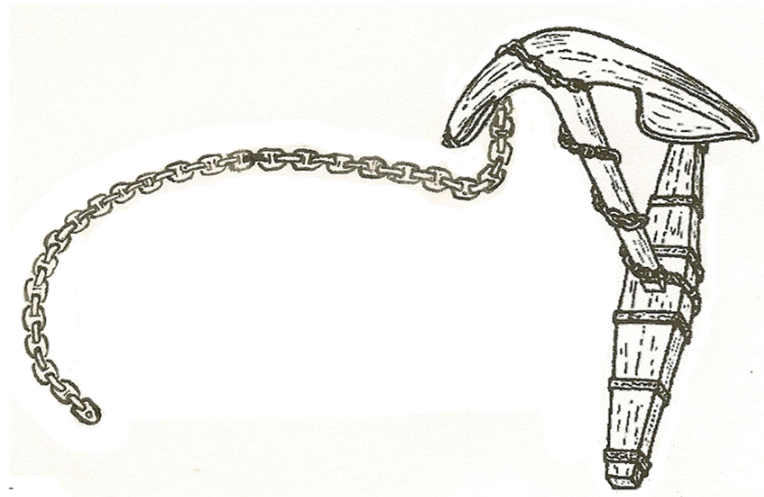

The race couldn't have been any closer. Only 1 corrected second separated the first and second place boats!

For the overall Single-handed Series results, congratulations goes to Relentless (Tracy Rogers) for taking first place, and to Lucky Duck (Paul McCarthy) and Pole Cat (Dan Doud) for tacking second and third place.

Commodore Kate Humphreys was on hand after the race to hand out awards and congratulate all of the single-handed sailors. A big thank you goes to John Ryan for his assistance in leading two of the four races this year, including this final race of the series. By the time racers showed up at the club both the race and series scores were computed and printed. It's pretty hard to get any more efficient than that!

The annual Barth Memorial Regatta was held on September 22nd. This is a team race that is held in the memory of Gustav Barth, a former member and Commodore of the Sequoia Yacht Club and a founding member of the Coyote Point Yacht Club. It is an on-going friendly rivalry between the two clubs and the winning club receives the honor of displaying the Barth trophy painting by Jim Dewitt for the next year. Sequoia will be keeping the trophy for one more year finishing first overall. We had a great turn out with 10 boats from Sequoia and six boats from Coyote Point. 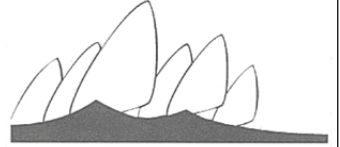
