



NAUTI-GIRLS' SAIL-AWAY CIOPPINO

(6-8 Servings)

- 1 Tablespoon olive oil
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 medium bulb of fennel, chopped (about 1 ½ cups)
- 1 large can (28 oz.) of Italian peeled tomatoes with garlic, oregano and basil
- 2 bottles clam juice
- 4 cups of water (actually, I use chicken broth or more clam juice with a bit of white wine)
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 lb. Linguica or Italian sausage (cut into chunks and pre-boiled to release the grease).
- 1 teaspoon fresh or dried basil, crushed or Italian herb mix
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 2 pinches of crushed red pepper flakes
- ½ cup of Orzo pasta or small shell pasta, uncooked
- 1 box of frozen artichoke hearts, quartered
- ½ lb. shelled, de-veined shrimp
- 1 cooked Dungeness crab (2 lbs.) or ½ lb. of white fish
- 1 ½ lbs. littleneck clams in shells (scrubbed)
- 1 lb. black mussels (scrubbed and de-bearded)
- 1/4 cup of chopped Italian parsley

Continued Cioppino Recipe from page 6:

- 1. In a large kettle, heat the olive oil over medium-low heat. Add the onion, garlic and fennel. Cook slowly for about 10 minutes, until soft and slightly browned.
- 2. Add the canned tomatoes, broth or clam juice, lemon juice and maybe some white wine you can spare.
- 3. Add in the linguica or sausage, and spices. Simmer on low for about 20 minutes. Add salt to taste. (Can stop process here and resume on your boat.)
- 4. Add uncooked pasta and artichoke hearts. Simmer (or re-heat) for a few minutes, then
- 5. Add the seafood, according to the size and weight—heavy first, with fish, then add the mussels and shrimp last. Cook until the clams and mussels have opened fully. Probably around 7-9 minutes. (Crab can be added to the broth, cover and cook for another 2 to 3 minutes.)
- 6. Ladle into wide bowls and sprinkle with parsley. Serve with plenty of crusty Italian bread. Enjoy!

The first annual **Port of Redwood City PortFest** is scheduled for **Saturday, Oct. 2**, at the **Port of Redwood City Marina**. It will kickoff with a pancake breakfast at the **Sequoia Yacht Club** from **8 a.m. to 10 a.m.**, with other public activities starting about **10:30 a.m**. 
