

The final SYC fiscal results for 2009 are in and look great! Net income for the year came in at \$28,623, a 56% increase over our target. Congratulations to all who made this possible. We will be able to post this to our reserve fund and it will make a huge difference in helping to finance the deck project and other needed improvements around the club. Our Treasurer, Winston Bumpus, presented our 2010 budget at our January General Meeting and it was approved by the membership. The new budget forecasts total net income for the period ending 12/31/2010 at \$22,164 after a last minute reduction of \$100 as SYC's donation to the South Bay Opening Day fund.

The deck improvement project is moving along, somewhat glacially, with permits under review by the Bay Conservation & Development Commission (BCDC) and the City of Redwood City. We expect to hear some results by early to mid-February. Ken Olcott and Caitlin Gilmore are doing a wonderful job of providing the engineering services we require and Herb Huber will be the contractor of record. Ron Brown just accepted the role of Deck Project Manger for the club. He will be providing project updates to the membership and be the one rallying members for volunteer work on the deck.

A special thanks to Sheila Jones for getting the Membership Directory for out so soon this year! If you don't have yours yet, be sure to drop by the club to pick one up.

I'm looking forward to seeing all of you on Super Bowl Sunday at the club for a fun afternoon. And, don't forget the Sweetheart's Ball on the 13th. It should be a wonderful party.

- -Provisions to protect against invasive species
- -Alternative anti-fouling paints

As we move into the latter part of both the Winter Series and the Redwood Cup Series races, SYC continues to demonstrate its commitment to winter racing. We are averaging around 15 boats per race and attracting racers from the Coyote Point Yacht Club.

Winter #3 was held on Sat., Jan. 9. There were 10 boats in the spinnaker division and 3 in the non-spinnaker division. The 13:00 start time came and went with nothing but calm winds at the starting area. Two postponements took place until the wind finally started to fill in at about 13:20. The first horn sounded at 13:25 and the race finally started at 13:30. The course was 3/4 - Ss - Ys - 3s/4 for a total of 3.77 miles. Although the winds were light all afternoon, the SYC racers were able to finish before the winds died once again in the late afternoon.

Congratulations to *Head Rush* (Charlie Watt) for taking first place, and to *Pizote* (John Ryan) and *Smokin J* (Stan Phillips) for taking second and third place respectively in the spinnaker division. In the non-spinnaker division *Iowa* (Rick Dalton) took first place, and *Linda Carol* (Ray Collier) and *Sweet Pea* (Tim Petersen) took second and third place respectively.

Redwood Cup #3 was held on Jan. 24, although the results were not available at the time of this writing. Check the SYC web site for details. Both series have two races to go, so now is the time to get out your calendars and mark the dates for the next races: Winter #4 on Feb. 6 and Redwood Cup #4 on Feb. 28. The Single-handed Series also starts on Sat. Feb. 20, so there are opportunities for everyone to get involved.

January also found the mysterious transformation of racing mark S from a yellow barrel to a red ball. The ball appears to be anchored using line instead of chain, so there is a bit of concern about its long-term survival. If anyone knows the story behind this change, please contact me. This may turn out to be a busy year for mark maintenance.

SEQUOIA READS: <u>The Sea of Cortez</u> by John Steinbeck and Edward F. Ricketts

ISBN 978-0-14-118607-8, Viking Press, 1941.

Early in 1940, Steinbeck and marine biologist, Ed Ricketts, hired a Monterey Bay sardine fishing boat, the *Western Flyer*, with a four-man crew, and spent six weeks travelling the coast the Gulf of California collecting biological specimens. The year after their return, Steinbeck and Ricketts published <u>Sea of Cortez: A Leisurely</u> Journal of Travel and Research, in which Steinbeck edited the daily journals of the trip with Ricketts' annotated specimen list.

The book is a travelogue and biological record, but also reveals the two men's philosophies: it dwells on the place of humans in the environment, the interconnection between single organisms and the larger ecosystem, and the themes of leaving and returning home. They also raised a number of ecological concerns, rare in 1940, that were way ahead of their times.

Look for a date for our discussion sometime in March, when **Steve and Laurie Holmstrom**, fresh from their own trip, will share their fantastic images of the Sea of Cortez.
